MBGFC President's 2024/25 Annual Report

The Year That Was

Well, you would have to say thank goodness for the yellow fin this season with marlin being few and far between particularly in our fishing grid area, with yellowfin 280 compared to 6 last seasons.

Although the total billfish is only slightly down 201 compared to 230 last year, the true reflection is that of those 201 billfish 51 were caught outside our area with many on the west coast. Another anomaly was shortbill spearfish up from 1 last season to 44 this season.

The leader board once again was hotly contested. Congratulations to the winners.

Champion angler: Nicola Candy

Champion Boat: Mile Zero

Some notable catches this season:

Again, Kelly Chambers needs special mention with a 10:1 catch of a 111.11 kg striped marlin on 10kg line.

As does the following: Asylum, 39 game fish mostly tagged and release, Mile Zero 30 game fish mostly tagged and released, Vamos 3 Junior club records and pin fish on 2kg, 3kg, 4kg, 6kg and Seasic 3 junior records. I am sure there are many other noteworthy catches and stories to be told.

The junior anglers really stepped up this season with 13 of 16 new club records going to juniors, this bodes well for the future.

Congratulations to all our new record holders, cup winners and pin certificate recipients.

Tournament Wrap Up

Majority of the tournaments went ahead as scheduled except for the No Bait Tournament which was postponed then cancelled due to weather, and the snapper interclub tournament also cancelled due to weather conditions.

Once again tournaments were well organised with good participation, a credit to the tournament convenors.

The return of the trailer boat was well received, with Garmin being naming sponsor for 3 years, and it is definitely on the calendar again in 2026.

A highlight this year was our centennial tournament - 100 boats all of which get their names on the cup base. Marlin only with no prizes, just competing to get your name on the trophy for the biggest fish and most points.

The Centennial celebration and prize giving was a fantastic night, 400 people attended with many in period dress and classic cars on display to add to the atmosphere, a presentation from the Boy Smith family of a 1950's club blazer in a glass case was very much appreciated.

Marlin proved a bit scarce with only 4 being caught, we had a very popular winner Bryce Hooton on Andiamo along with his skippers Bruce Ellwood and Chase Wotten and crew, caught the heaviest marlin 130.3kg (heaviest of the season) as well as a tag and release to get the most points as well.

With the success of the Centennial and the need for a marlin tournament the committee has announced a new tournament for the 25-26 season the MBGFC Offshore Classic (25 - 28/02/2026). Species will be marlin, broadbill swordfish, mahimahi and tuna, and prizes will be on a cash in cash out basis.

The Commercial Health of the Club

Like most businesses in Whitianga particularly hospitality, this year was a challenging economic environment to operate in.

There were three drivers that contributed to a recorded loss of ninety-six thousand dollars.

- 1. They were, reduced turn over 11 percent, costs of goods increasing squeezing margins and not receiving a significant income from the Kubota this year.
- 2. Operating costs have largely stayed in line with last year an increase of 7K, while despite new initiatives and best efforts the kitchen continues to make a significant loss.
- 3. The auditor requiring a provision for staff leave for the first time has added a 37k liability compared to last year and there is a non-cash provision of 27K for depreciation.

Our cash reserve currently sit at \$220,000. this only dropped 42k despite investing \$86k on capital items like a new oven and cook top for the kitchen and our catch master system.

The Club is solvent, and this remains within our policy of having 100k in reserves, but there is no doubt that we will be facing a challenging year ahead to make the books balance.

There will be a line-by-line review conducted with many smaller initiatives being considered and larger ones not ruled out.

There was a decrease in membership from 3366 to 2905 members which was pretty much in line with a decrease of day memberships from the Kubota.

Constitution

As I mentioned last year, in line with NZ Government Legislation we need to update our constitution to comply with the Incorporated Societies Act which comes into effect on 26 April 2026. Special thanks to a dedicated team led by Anne Smal VP, with Colleen and Damian Jaques, who put out a draft constitution for consultation. That consultation is now complete and the draft finalised. We are now seeking your support to adopt the new constitution at our AGM. Even if approved we will still be working under the old constitution for the next 12 months with the new constitution coming into effect September 2026.

Regulatory

The Hauraki Marine Park Legislation continues to slowly grind its way through Parliament, the formation of the two high protection areas (reserves) out from the Alderman Islands now seems inevitable.

We had a new threat to our right to fish when the Environmental Defence Society challenged the Waikato Regional Councils Coastal Plan, stating they believed that biodiversity wasn't given sufficient consideration, their remedy was to form high protection area's (reserves)around the Alderman islands, all of the Mercury Islands, Cuvier Island and the top of the Coromandel plus bits of the West Coast.

I believe we submitted a very strong argument against their proposal. We covered areas of social, economic, and environmental issues. A shout out to the New Zealand Sports Fishing Council whose submission we were part of as was the local Business Association, The NZSFC brought an expert witness marine biologist and legal support. I do not believe our case would have been anywhere a strong without there support.

Club Governance

We have been fortunate again this year to have a committee that understands fishing and wants to promote sport fishing but also understands their governance role.

Special thanks to our VP Anne Smal, her contribution to the club has been immense again this year.

Also, a big shout out to the retiring Committee members Anne Smal, Brad Johnson and Dave Enright, thank you for you contribution to the governance of the club.

A huge shout out to Warren Harris who is retiring from the role of Patron this year he has been a driving force behind the club for 25 years plus. Warren has held many roles including Committee Member, President, Patron, Weighmaster extraordinaire, MBGFC Life Member, NZSFC Life Member and mentor to many. Warren your contribution to the club over last 25 years plus has been immense, and very much appreciated.

Our Club Is Our Volunteers

As with any club there is a huge number of people that contribute to the success of a club.

There is no question that for this club to function we need keen enthusiastic volunteers.

We held 12 tournaments this year. A huge shout out to the people who put their hand up to be tournament conveners, without them tournaments just do not happen! Tournaments are a huge part of our club's identity, and this role is not always an easy one.

We have 16 trained weighmasters who give their time freely, often when they would rather be fishing themselves. Thank you for your time, dedication, and integrity.

Also thank you to all the volunteers whether it be helping put up tents, selling raffle tickets or driving the courtesy van, you make the running of the club so much easier and contribute to the success of the club.

Sponsors shout out - Other key components of our club are our sponsors, your support is greatly appreciated as it allows us to make our tournaments more exciting and it keeps the club viable and able to focus on our membership. Our club sponsorship is provided in various forms, from our grid sponsors to leader board sponsors, tournament sponsors and general sponsors. I encourage you to know who these are and to support our sponsors when making retail decisions.

Our Commercial Team

I commented last year on our awesome staff and that is still the case this year. I would like to recognise the professionalism of our staff; we are truly fortunate with the calibre of staff we have.

We took the clubs yearbook in-house this year, thank you to all the people who contributed particularly Sarah and Caroline for putting together something I believe we can be proud of.

Thank you John our General Manager for your dedication during a challenging year.

Finally thank you to my wife Anne for her support, I know she has one or two ideas on how to fill my calendar after I stand down at the AGM.

A real privilege of this role has been opportunity to meet so many genuinely good people, way too many to name. Thank you all for your support.
