PRESIDENTS REPORT

Despite 2 cyclones and road access issues it is a pleasure to be able to write my first annual report with the club financially sound and in good heart.

The fishing started off strongly and had all the indications of being another bumper year with 30 marlin being caught by the $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ of January compared with 13 the year before, and yellowfin tuna also featuring strongly.

Then the above-mentioned cyclones Gabriel and Hale arrived, plus the dreaded South Easterly winds which severely restricted the number of days that boats could get out.

The leader board has been hotly contested again this year, congratulations to the winners.

Champion Angler, Tony Croft and Champion Team, Mad Max.

Also, congratulations to Thomas Maxwell and the team on Mad Max for defending the John Hough Memorial Trophy for the individual team scoring the most points in the striped marlin section in the Nationals. Other trophy winners in the Nationals were Dan and Melissa Ford on Mabel – Dennis Davey Trophy for Team Champion Mahimahi, and Jeremy Waterer and Marcus Wunderlich on Mercy – C.D. Rods Trophy for Overall Team Champions. Congratulations to you all.

For the NZSFC Annual Trophy Awards, congratulations to Tony Croft for winning the Saul Trophy – most tagged gamefish and The Peter & Noeline Short Memorial Trophy – most tagged billfish. This capped off an incredibly successful and memorable year for Tony.

I would also like to congratulate club trophy winners and those who caught pin fish or new club records.

Surprisingly all the Tournaments apart from the Top Ten Tuna Tournament went ahead as scheduled, despite the weather challenges. The Open had an awesome weather window - not so much the Girls in the Bay, which was still a huge success with 254 entries.

The Kubota Billfish Classic took a step change this year with 265 boats ,1200 anglers and a cash prize pool of \$642000 plus \$150000 of other Prizes awarded which makes it the biggest cash prize tournament in the southern Hemisphere.

It was great to see people coming into our community to fish these tournaments despite the effects of the cyclones, road access issues etc, and supporting local businesses.

Despite a challenging and uncertain business environment the club has shown a profit with a significant increase in sales in all trading areas including bar, kitchen, raffles and clothing.

A profit of \$36,207 for the year is a huge turnaround from the year before.

Some of the increase in turnover was because of an increase in patronage, which has been consistently above last year. An indication of that was a new record of 72 meat raffles sold on a Thursday Club night - significantly above the previous record of 57.

There has been a slight increase in members by 102 to 3121.

It was interesting how many people follow our club through social media particularly during tournaments, with 15485 followers on Facebook and 1189 on Instagram. For the 6 months to 3rd July 2023 the reach on Facebook was 2,418,608.

Outdated computer programs were identified by the committee as a risk to the operation of the club. One was 30 years old and when it failed support was limited if available at all.

We now have changed the accounting package to cloud based Xero and are in the process of updating our data base and tournament software, I would like to acknowledge the huge contribution of Anne Smal to this process.

Thank you to all of you that responded to the click and send submission process we sent out with help of Legasea. The 2000 responses that Environment Waikato received gave them a very clear message that creating marine reserves are not a role they should get involved in.

An issue for the upcoming year is a review of our constitution. There has been a change to the Incorporated Societies Act and all societies are going to have to reregister to meet new requirements. We will canvas members views before we propose any changes, and hopefully have something for next year's AGM.

As with any club there is a huge number of people that contribute to the success of a club.

We have been fortunate this year to have a committee that has been solution focused, it seemed that no matter what the issue was, someone either had the answer, had dealt with something similar and would sort it or knew someone that could.

To the retiring committee Graham van de Laar, Brook Johnstone, John Booker, and John Grant your contribution is really appreciated.

Special thanks to our VP Anne Smal particularly for the work you have put into the computer program upgrade.

To the tournament conveners, these tournaments are a huge part of our club's identity and don't just happen. They take a huge amount of planning and possibly the odd sleepless night.

I also note that planning is well down the track for the tournament season ahead. Thank you for your time and dedication.

We have 16 trained weigh masters who give their time freely, often when they would rather be fishing themselves. Thank you for your time, dedication and integrity.

Also thank you to all the volunteers, whether it be helping put up tents, selling raffle tickets or driving the courtesy van. You make the running of the club so much easier.

Also, a big shout to the sponsors your contribution is huge and keeps the club viable and able to focus on our membership.

Thanks John Neighbours our past president for both handing the club over in good shape and for continuing in your role of editor and publisher of our yearbook.

I would also like to recognise our awesome staff; we are truly fortunate with the calibre of staff we have. I have had so much positive feedback about your professionalism, which really does contribute to the success and atmosphere of the club.

A huge part of the success of our club is the leadership, knowledge and dedication of our manager Alan Proctor, thank you Alan it certainly helps my job knowing the club is in such good hands.

Finally thank you to my wife Anne for your support even when I have a meeting and the forecast is 5 knots variable.
